The FBCG Sunday School recognized Dr. King's birthday on Sunday, January 16, 2022, with an outstanding presentation by High School Student, Xavier Swann!

Xavier Swann honored us with an excellent recorded video presentation of highlights from the life and history of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. He reminded us that Dr. Martin Luther King's Birthday for the year 2022 is celebrated/ observed on **Monday, January 17th**. He noted that Dr. Martin Luther King Day is observed on the third Monday of January, which is close to King's actual birthday on January 15. Martin Luther King Jr. was an American Baptist minister and activist who became the most visible spokesperson and leader in the civil rights movement from 1954 until his death in 1968. He was born in Atlanta, Georgia and is best known for advancing civil rights through nonviolence and civil disobedience. His tactics were inspired by his Christian beliefs and the nonviolent activism of Mahatma Gandhi. He was the son of early civil rights activist and minister Martin Luther King Sr.
